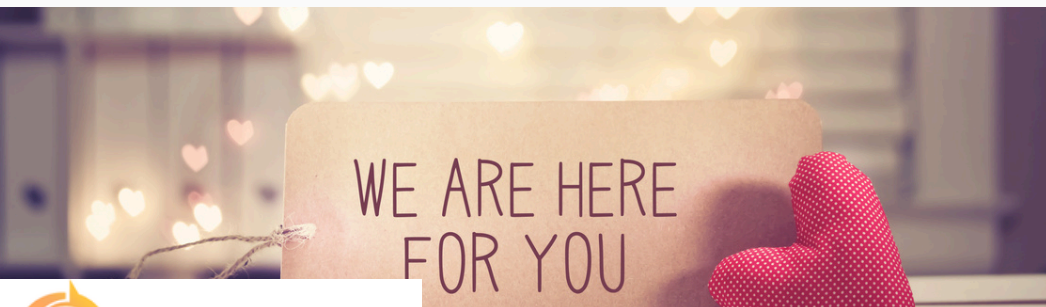

As always, thank you for being an important part of Vantage Point. We're looking forward to a great start to the summer.

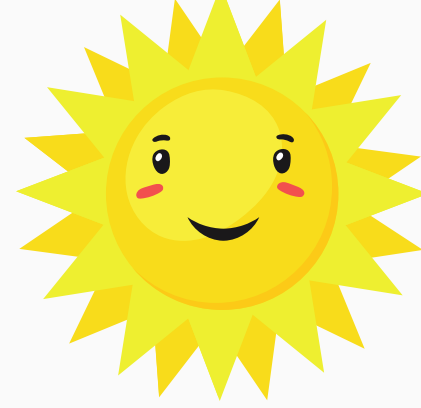

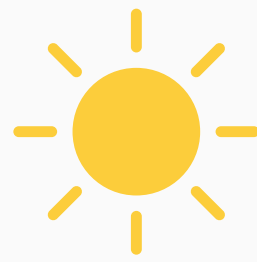

3. Early voting is open from **Thursday, June 11–Thursday, June 18** from 7 A.M. until 8 P.M.

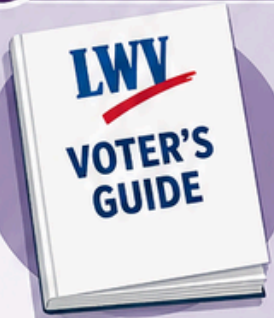


4. Election Day is **Tuesday, June 23** from 7 A.M. until 8 P.M.

Trip Level System

Designed to help residents choose outings that are enjoyable, appropriate, and comfortable for their individual abilities, while also supporting overall trip safety and planning.

**Please note level ratings are noted on posters and sign up sheets.*

- **Trip Level I:** Very little walking required and rollator accessible. Examples may include lunch outings, dinner outings, musical performances, concerts, and speaker events.
- **Trip Level II:** Requires the ability to be on your feet or seated for up to one hour and is rollator accessible. Examples may include accessible museum tours, restaurants, shopping trips, and similar outings.
- **Trip Level III:** Physically strenuous and may involve extensive walking, uneven terrain, or all-day activity. Examples may include walking tours/hikes, festivals, large museums, city excursions, outdoor events, aquarium or zoo visits, sporting events, and trips requiring longer distances to be navigated independently.

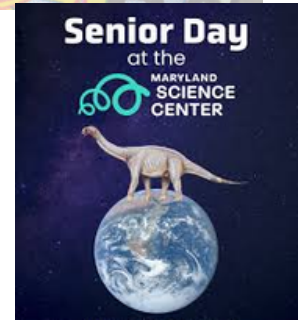

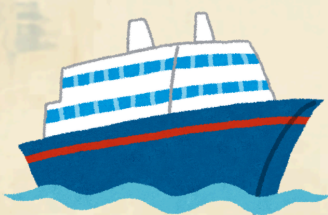
